

Fiber Arts Retreat Registration July 21-23, 2023

- Registration for Partridge Hill Farm Fiber Arts Retreat opens on April 10th, 2023. All registration forms must be postmarked by June 15th, 2023.
- Registration is only available to persons aged 18 or older, unless the minor is accompanied by an adult who is also registered.
- Registration is limited to 20 participants.
- Registration fee is \$25. This fee includes reserving your place in the retreat, participation
 in the mordanting & dyeing activities, dyeing journal with instructions and pages for
 notes. Elective classes are not included (see menu on the last page).
- Limited accommodation available in the Farmhouse (on site, three bedrooms) and Heidi's
 Cottage (walking distance on same road, three bedrooms) is \$110 per person. Cash,
 Paypal, or check accepted- no credit cards. For farmhouse and cottage overnight
 guests, accommodation fee is due at check-in, and is non-refundable. Accommodation
 includes self-serve breakfast. Couples may register together, on one form.

Regarding meals: Folks are welcome to bring their own lunches, or order from local delivery/takeout options. Farmhouse and cottage guests have exclusive use of the kitchens. Menus for local options will be available on Friday evening. Tables will be set up in the open barn, and outside if weather permits.

Schedule and Electives: The activity menu, with descriptions and fees, is attached on the back pages. Please note class maximum size when choosing. Classes will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. *Please pay the class instructor directly, at the start of the class.*

Friday Evening 4:00-8:30 "Fiber Prep for Dyeing" We will give our yarns and roving their mordant soak for Saturday's dyeing extravaganza. Bring your own wool yarns or roving, or purchase locally-sourced wool fiber. The process takes approximately 1 hour. Mordant soak station will be open in the barn (with instructor) until 8:30pm, so plan to start by 7:00. (fee included with registration)

Saturday Morning 9:00 start "Adventures in Dyeing!" We will use natural dyes such as madder, avocado, indigo, cochineal, and native plants such as jewelweed. We will experiment with additives such as iron and copper, to create color variations. Wear an apron, smock, or clothes that are "ruinable" in case of dye splatter, and bring rubber/dishwash gloves. (fee included with registration)

Mordant Soak "Party"

Many natural dyes require a mordant soak in order to bond with the fiber. Purchase locally-sourced wool roving and/or yarn, or bring your own, and learn how to prepare your fiber for Saturday morning's dyeing exravaganza!

(fee included with retreat registration)

Plan approximately 1 ½ hours for your mordant soak. The mordant station will be available in the barn from 4:00-8:30pm. The rug weaving workshop is a fun way to spend the wait time while your fiber is soaking, or continue working on your needle felted mouse.

Rug Weaving

(with Juli H)
We will weave a
34in. width rug
from hand dyed
wool roving
using the peg
loom, and finish
the rug on the
needle felting



machine. The felting finish adds durability to the rug. No prior experience necessary. Use your own roving or purchase roving in a variety of colorways at the start of class. Limit 4 participants. (\$80 includes hand dyed roving) Cotton warping thread, needle, and loaner loom provided.

Bring your own white wool/silk fiber or purchase locally sourced fiber (limited quantity available).

Felted Soap Making

Donna C will teach you how to make hand-crafted and all-natural felted soap. The wool coat helps soap last longer, and makes slippery bars easy to hang on to. The wool is very gently exfoliating, and paired with the handmade soap is luxurious. Limit 6 participants. (\$25 includes wool and handmade soap)



Brioche Knitting

(with Lucie S) Here is a chance to try your hand at two color brioche stitch. We will make a neck warmer in the round. Knowledge of knitting basics needed for this class.

You will need 100 yards of two contrasting colors of worsted weight varn and size 6

circular needle 16 inches long. (\$25.00)

Fun with Color in Spinning

(with Cathy C). Learning ways to create innovative color mixes will make your spinning more varied, more useful for a range of projects, and more importantly, MORE FUN! Whether you spin for weaving, knitting or crochet, you will go home with sample yarns created from your color blends, as well as some batts to spin on your own. Learn how to use each of the following to create color blends for spinning: blending board, drum carder, combs, hackles,

and hand cards.

(with Lucie S) Create a unique silk scarf by imprinting it with flowers and leaves. No prior experience needed. \$40 class fee includes one

Needle Felted Shadowbox

Patsy F will show you how to make a sweet 5x5in shadow box that can hang on the wall or sit on the shelf. We'll create a background and bring it to life with added features. The only limitation is your imagination! Bring along pics for inspiration if you'd like. You can use pictures for inspiration and/or any special embellishment you would like to add. (\$50 includes all materials.) Limit 8 participants.



Reversible Knitting

Julie D will guide you in making a sampler of stitches that look great on BOTH sides. Perfect for scarves, shawls, afghans, bags, or just as an accent stitch or edging. Participants should know basic knitting stitches: knit, purl, slip stitch, simple cable, increase and decrease. Materials- Bring knitting needles, cable needle and yarn of your choice. Should be smooth, light color yarn with

appropriate size needles for good stitch definition (ie. worsted weight yarn and size 7-8 needles, or DK weight with size 5-6 needles).

(\$25 fee includes: Printed/PDF instructions for Sampler,and reference list for free patterns)

Coil Basket Making

Devin D will teach you the meditative process of weaving sacred spirals into a beautiful fiber basket. We will work with

20 ft of roping, one metal tapestry needle, and mill end yarn scraps from a local mill. Metaphorically and physically, we'll establish a solid core, spiral out, and then build up in infrastructure to create a beautiful container. (\$35 fee includes all materials and tapestry needle.) Limit 15 participants



OR take this time to practice spinning, finish rug weaving, work on that brioche technique, finish your shadowbox or coiled basket, or relax with a fiber project from home.
